


Be Steadfast THE COURAGE OF OUR CONVICTIONS

"Be strong and courageous, do not be afraid or tremble at them, for the Lord your God is the one who goes with you. He will not fail you or forsake you." Deuteronomy 31:6 (NASB)

Courage is becoming a regular garment that we must put on every day to face the irregular challenges in our lives, churches, communities and country. Courage could have remained a casual garment, like an ordinary jacket worn on a chilly day. Now courage must be more like body armor intentionally worn under that jacket when there is a need for bravery in the face of some atrocity.

Courage once was a common thread woven into the fabric of our character, called upon every now and then. Today, "every now and then" has become every day. There is an increasing need for spiritual, physical, moral, mental and creative courage. Daily our sensibilities are assaulted. We are faced with choices to act upon the courage of our convictions or become silent witnesses to the normalization of negative biases.

History books are filled with courageous men and women who chose to act at great personal risks. Bishop Richard Allen led the first civil rights march out of St George's church to worship in dignity at the genesis of our founding. The Reverend Nat Turner, an AME Pastor in South Carolina, preached and acted against enslavement in South Carolina. The Senator Hiram Revels, an AME pastor, served in Congress during reconstruction. The Reverend Oliver Brown, an AME pastor in Topeka, Kansas, was instrumental in the Supreme Court case Brown vs Board of Education that led to school desegregation.

Let's be encouraged. Let's be encouraging. Let's be courageous! Let's be steadfast unmovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord and our labor shall not be in vain! (I Corinthians 15:58)


