Historic Bethel

St. Petersburg

Blessed with a \$341k historical preservation grant, the 122-year old anchor of Methodist Town was restored to period splendor. All Trades Historical Restoration Company would eventually take up the mantle of mending not only the West Wall, but of extending the life of Historic Bethel, the oldest church in the city of St. Petersburg by 100 years or more. The Rev. Kenneth F. Irby, Pastor, led the oversight team of trustees: Sam Hemingway and Jan Nelson and steward Willie Felton.
