1. Achievements

- The Program between University of Pretoria and R.R. Wright has yielded positive results. Rev Mokgoko and Mengoae obtained B.A. Honors degrees and Rev Diale and Rev Sefatsa completed Master of Arts in Practical Theology.
- We have improved on income streams with the leasing of part of the Campus being able to raise R90 000.00 in the last twelve months
- Registration and accreditation process is on course with 78% compliance on occupation health, safety, and fire regulations.
- Registration of curriculum and qualifications of NQF level 7 is 78% complete.
- Identification and recruitment of academic staff is on course.
- MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING with the PAYNE Theological Seminary was established in on the 3rd of February 2021. Our agreement is that they offer their Master of Divinity (Mdiv) to 15 or our students at the beginning of the year 2022. This has been deferred and Bishop Brailsford is helping to reestablish the agreement after our laison Rev. Morne left Payne.
- REFURBISHMENT OF THE DEAN'S RESIDENCE: R20 000 was raised to refurbish the house. We also acknowledge the contribution of curtains and a bed from Charlotte Maxeke Ladies Fellowship.
 - CAMPUS IMAGE: Our deployment of Rev. Motsiri Isaac Mokotedi and Sister Sibongile Khosa to respectively serve as the office manager and cleaner has immensely enhanced the allure and neatness of our campus.

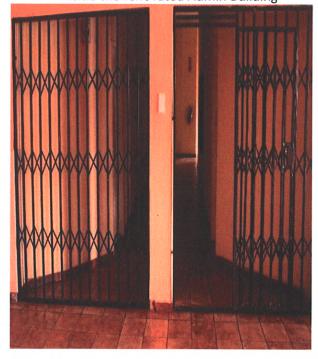


2.) Admin Building

Was erected in 1958. The Building is so;id need renovation.

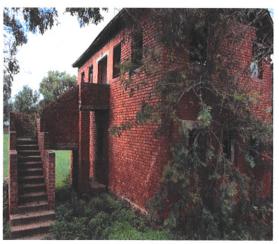

3. Campus facilities

4. Academic enrolment

- a. No students have been registered for this academic year. The South African government legislation prohibits us from enrolling students without provisional or full accreditation.
- b. This has driven us to fo focus all energy on registration and accreditation of the institution and acquiring NQF7.

5. Ministry Formation Classes

We have developed a programme with the 19th Episcopal Board of Examiners Deans. The program will equip candidates for ministry in their ministry formation. Upon finalisation students will attend contact classes at the R.R.Wright Campus four times a year.

6. Challenges

- a. The constant burglaries by vandals, looters and thieves compromise the safety and security of our staff, property, and campus guards. On the 3rd of October 2021, there was a burglary whereby our security officer was held hostage. He had to receive trauma counselling. Despite these challenges, security locks were installed, and campus safety restored. New doors were bought to replace all the damaged ones.
- b. Slow processes of Government: The application processes of government are slow, and we are unable to start our academic programs without their approval.
- Limited financial sponsorships since companies are on recovery processes after hard lockdowns.
