is sure, and our faith is indisputable. We are alive. We are not just alive; we are yet alive! Our spirits sing with the Savior's joy, we give glory and praise to Jesus for his redeeming grace.

- Bishop: The Church has been preserved by God's keeping power to proclaim our theme:"From Legacy to Mission: A Call to Prophetic, Educational and Social Engagement."God's preservation led us through the sadness of life, the challenges of our faith, and the assault of the enemy.
- People: We confronted the pandemics of Covid-19; a frontal assault and murder of the lives of African Americans and people of the Diaspora; the crisis of demonic governmental leadership rising in all parts of the world, and a crisis of faith in God, and institutions. Even so, AME Schools received national acknowledgment, restoration of accreditation, new students, greater finances, and innovative programs. We built a new Sunday School Union, published the AME Discipline in Spanish, and saw expansions beyond our imaginations because we are preserved by power divine.
- Bishop: We assemble with joy, some with unjoy; some in strength, others in un-strength delighted to be in the presence of God and with each other. Seeing faces we thought we would never see again, and missing faces we will greet on the other side. We have faced schisms, denominational confusion, digital divide, doctrinal discord, and global crisis. But fightings without and fears within did not win for the AME brand was manifested in creative ways by the resilience of local congregations and the leadership of the Church.
- People: Life brought struggle, anguish, and conflict. We were pained at the deaths of AME leaders and African American leadership. Our rage erupted in response to daily murders of African Americans. Our hearts were burdened with continual media and social media assaults on our communities and churches. The quest for justice united us, COVID-19 deaths equalized us, depression and isolation fused our hearts in search for healing, and the yearning for in place worship bonded us. Alive we prayed and worked together in spirit and in truth.
- Bishop: Yet out of all God has brought us by Divine love; and still our God still help and hides our life above.
- People: God did a new thing, a new way. We were the church of Allen away from the buildings yet still together, still alive. Technology moved from being criticized to complimented. We accomplished many things we thought would never be done. Young adults emerged. Online conferences connected the Connection, natural disasters galvanized us, injustices motivated us to fight once again. Our spiritual roots compelled us to be the Church not at the church to address disparities and serve the needs of the Black, Brown and underserved communities disproportionately impacted by poverty, hunger, sickness, and the need for coronavirus vaccines.
- Bishop: By God's love we are here, never giving up, never turning around. We are here to boast of God's redeeming power and to take up the cross till we the crown obtain. We are here; and yet alive.
